THY KINGDOM COME - 29th May to 8th June

Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus. Every Christian across the globe is invited to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of 5 people who have not yet responded with their 'Yes' to God's call. Over the course of these next days, think of five people who are on your heart and who you can be praying for.

Thursday 5th: Pray for your five people. That they will discover that Jesus walks alongside them and will help them when they are tempted.

Friday 6th: Do pray for your five people that they will be kept safe from evil and learn to hear the voice of God.

Saturday 7th: Ask God to give you boldness to share the good news of Jesus with your five people as and when appropriate. Pray for the Holy Spirit to fill them with God's love.
